Both Sarah Woolley from the Bakers Union (BFAWU) and Professor Keith Ewing of King's College London, will be analysing how the trade union movement may respond to such threats.

As well as these important topics, our experts will discuss a wide range of burning issues from modern employment tribunals to key cases on religion and belief.
